It's important to note that the word basket is only a generic term for the container for your theme. Feel free to use your imagination....use a tub, box, bucket, tote, wheel barrow, whatever you want to hold your stuff!

There are several ways a 'basket' can be put together. A group can put everything together from start to finish, supplying the container and all items, or you can provide the items and we'll take care of putting the finishing touches on the final presentation and finding a container. 
#### **Build Your Own Worship Activity Bag Center**

#### Leadership Board Meeting February 12, 2024

This board meeting started with a prayer lead by Kylie Shoyer.

Bob lead a discussion on the introduction of Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations. A few themes of the discussion were that actions speak louder than words and to grow as a church in today's world, trying new things is necessary and if they don't work, there's no fault in trying, we should celebrate trying. The leadership board signed the covenant.

Pastor Stacy and Bob Moore spoke on praises and problems. Two new small groups of spiritual formation were started; artist's way and a woman's small group. The Confirmation class has participants signed up and is in the process of being scheduled with everyone's calendars. Pastor Eva is creating a children's space to build their own worship bags for each service. With Lent starting, we are sharing services with community partners and want to collect feedback on these collaborations. Bob discussed issues with how long it is taking to received the 2023 end of year numbers from our accounting partners.

The Board discussed strategic planning. How do we get to the goal of Everyone Belongs. Discussed legacy giving and potentially holding a workshop for the community on giving. Nicole Paul discussed updating the Guiding Principals to be less verbose and easier to absorb. The Board also discussed leadership board standing teams and assignments

Bob lead a discussion on the budget around fund resolution. We discussed moving towards 8 buckets of giving so funds can be tracked more accurately. Bob sorted the existing funds into the following 8 categories: Worship/Creative Arts/Office, Congregational Care, Mission & Outreach, Faith Formation, and Youth & Young Adult. The goal would be to make giving and tracking funds easier for all. The board discussed looking into a nonprofit church accountant.

An executive session was held.





Donate much-needed men's underwear to Philadelphia prison inmates for Easter.

Each inmate arriving into the Philadelphia Prison System is given ONE pair of underpants and no undershirts. Can you imagine living with only one pair of underpants?

Two years ago, in our first Undies for Easter Campaign, your generosity provided over 2000 men's briefs and over 2000 men's undershirts.\* Head

Chaplain Carmelo Urena is now again in need of assistance, as he aims to provide at least one additional pair of briefs and an undershirt to each individual entering incarceration.

The need has grown as the number of people in the Philadelphia prison system has increased significantly from about 6000 to about 8000. The needs of about 300 women there are being addressed by a number of other organizations. The men in the system do not have this support. So our new campaign will focus on providing briefs and undershirts for the men.

We have set up a new Undies for Easter Gift Registry on Amazon.com. tinyurl.com/2024Undies4Easter

Anyone can easily purchase online packages of selected Hanes underwear, containing nine pairs of men's white briefs—medium or large—and Hanes 6-packs of undershirts in large and X-large. They will benefit the health and wellness of our incarcerated brothers. The cost may vary, but it should be affordable and worthwhile.

We hope to again collect and deliver at least 2,000 pairs of briefs and undershirts through this campaign to support the chaplain's efforts. This campaign will end on Palm Sunday, March 24; and all purchased underwear will be delivered to the chaplain before Easter Sunday.
