Please Be Sure Your Safe Sanctuary Clearances Are Up to Date!

All people who volunteer with children and youth at Grove Church or need to be in the building during Grove Preschool hours Monday to Friday, must have up to date clearances on file in the church office. These consist of a PA Criminal History clearance, a ChildLine clearance from the Dept. of Human Services, and, if employed as staff, an FBI clearance.

For groups that may need to meet during Grove Preschool hours, the designated leader must have clearances and gather his/her entire group in the Lobby of the church and escort the entire group to the meeting room and have the whole group dismiss together so they can be escorted to the exit. This provides safety for the children.

They say April showers bring May flowers, so we should have lots of flowers this year. The abundance of rain this spring is creating challenges for our Good Works volunteers. Some jobs repairing homes and restoring hope simply can't be done in wet weather, like pouring concrete or

sealing the flashing on the chimney. But others, like securing gutters and repairing downspouts can be, so our dedicated volunteers are out there working even in the rain.

One thing we can always be sure of in this weather. Water will find a way to get into the house if there is one. The new roof fixed most, but not all, of the problems. We'll keep tracking them down and sealing things up until every leak is fixed.

Another challenge of working in an old house is that plumbing and electrical work tends to be tricky. No problem is ever simple to fix. We typically get through these jobs with support from Good Works staff and a bit of help from YouTube.

But what we could really use is someone who knows their way around electrical stuff who would volunteer some hours on a workday, someone to figure out what's wrong with the exterior outlet that blows the circuit every time something

gets plugged in, check and repair the electric in various rooms, and replace a light fixture or two. Are you that person? Would you be willing to help us out for all or part of just one workday? That would be such a blessing.

We're making good progress with other work at Renee's. Imagine her delight with having a working stove and oven after being without one for 5 years. New faucets in the

kitchen and bathroom replaced the leaky ones she'd tried to seal with duct tape. The new storm doors let light and fresh air in and enable Renee to look out on the beauty of Spring as it unfolds.

The dank and dreary back room has been cleared of much of its accumulated stuff, and with water damage repairs completed and new paint and flooring, can soon be put to any number of good uses. The large shed out back is nice and water-tight with its new roof and can provide Renee with some much-

needed storage space.

On our May workday, we'll be installing siding and soffits, replacing water-damaged drywall, painting walls, and putting down flooring. Volunteers are learning new skills as they work on these projects, skills that they'll be able to apply at houses we work on in the future or even in their own homes. It's very rewarding.

And so, our mission to repair homes and restore hope continues. New volunteers are always welcome, and we'd love for you to come with us to participate on a workday in the near future. It's a lot of fun and very satisfying. Just contact goodworks@grovechurch.org for information.

An Amazing Accomplishment by the People of Grove Church!

2540 Lunches to date (April 30, 2024)

A recent visit to Safe Harbor demonstrated to Judy Wadsworth, the facilitator of Grove's participation, how critical the Community Lunch mission is to the

homeless of Chester County.

Safe Harbor currently houses 20 men and 20 women at their location on Matlack Street in West Chester. The county knows of over 400 more in need of this service. In addition to housing, the men and women are provided with three meals per day. The facility provides beds and showers, along with lockers for each person. Structured programming and activities provide a holistic approach with opportunities for connection, personal growth, and well-being for residents. Community organizations provide funds through independent activities. Recently, Safe Harbor has celebrated the opening of a community garden in partnership with the Melton Center.

Grove currently provides 30 lunches on the 3rd and 4th Tuesdays of every month. Dedicated Grove members make and deliver the lunches on a regular basis, but more volunteers are needed. Please consider responding to the next request by lunches@GroveChurch.org. You, with friends or family members, can pack a sandwich, chips, fruit, water and an additional treat in a paper bag and deliver them directly to Safe Harbor at the designated time; a staff member will be there to assist if needed.



The Preschool has been very busy the last couple of weeks. A few highlights from April include: the classes were visited by a police officer from West Chester University for "P" day, the Tooth Fairy stopped by for "T" day and taught them all about dental hygiene, and they helped to plant the Community Garden behind the church office. The children enjoyed learning

about and planning for the Solar Eclipse even though the clouds blocked out most of the actual event. Miss Sue from Makin' Music was here to sing and dance with each class.

They have all enjoyed spending time outside on the playground as the weather starts

to warm up a bit.
